How does the CFO look at Vascular Surgery?


- Contribution to Indirects...CTI

Do Not Be Confused

Downstream Revenue is Not CTI

CTI Look at Five Common Vascular Procedures

- AV Graft
- AV fistula
- EVAR
- CEA
- Angiogram extremity



- We are still making the hospital money,
- But Our CTI is Down!

Why are we suffering financially more than other specialties?

Payor Mix

- Most Hospitals...
- Lose significant money on Medicaid patients
- Lose a little money on Medicare patients
- Make money on Private Insurance patients
- So, they try to increase private insurance patients

CFO Thinking

- If I make a profit on a procedure in a 54-year-old with private insurance
- If I barely break even on a proceedure in a 68-year-old with Medicare...
- Which test would I rather perform?

Patient Calling in for a Colonoscopy

- I am 54 and I need a colonoscopy....reply from the booking office "how about next week"
- I am 68 and I need a colonoscopy....reply from the booking office "how about in 4 months"

Where Vascular Surgery Stands

Mean age sports medicine patients ...35 - 26 years

Mean age adult hernia repair...53 years

Mean age spine surgery patients...54 years

Mean age carotid enterectomy patients...71 years

Summary

- In most hospitals, Vascular Surgery remains a profit center
- Our CTI has decreased
- Due to the age demographics, a large proportion of our patients have Medicare coverage
- \bullet No matter what, most hospitals $\ \ need \ us!$
